



Clean solar energy for madagascar power plant

Through the Scaling Solar initiative, in March 2016, IFC signed an agreement with the Malagasy Government to construct a plant of approximately 25 MW, connected to the Antananarivo network, ...

This expansion enables the plant to supply renewable electricity to nearly 100,000 households, contributing to Madagascar's goal of achieving 80% renewable energy in its mix by 2030.

The aim is to double renewable energy production and achieve an electrification rate of 75% by 2030. Several infrastructures are under construction, including a 100 MW plant in ...
